I am a member of a gym, a member of a synagogue, a member of several professional (legal) organizations, a member of the Auxiliary of three Veterans organizations. What does this say about me? What do your memberships say about you?

The gym membership shows that I care about my physical (and mental) health.

The membership in my synagogue demonstrates my commitment to my faith. The membership in several professional organizations shows that I am trying to improve my own legal skills,

and to improve the legal profession overall.

The membership in three Auxiliaries show that I support veterans. Granted, I am only active in one of these veterans organizations – the American Legion Auxiliary – but I pay dues to and read the Newsletter of the Jewish War Veterans, and the 392nd Bomb Group Memorial Organization. I am a member of the Jewish War Veterans to honor my grandfather, a Veteran of World War I. Plus, my grandmother was a member of the Auxiliary of the Jewish War Veterans, so when I learned there was a chapter here in Las Vegas, I knew I had to join, too! I am a member of the 392nd Bomb Group because that organization contains the survivors of that World War II group and their descendants; my Uncle George was a member of that group; he was killed in action during WWII on a bombing run from England over Germany; he was the plane's Navigator. Incidentally, paying dues to the American Legion Auxiliary, without any other involvement, is still very meaningful! Critical mass is important; just being able to lobby our elected officials for legislation important for the welfare of veterans, active-duty military, and their families as part of an organization of thousands of people has an impact! So thank you for being a member of the American Legion Auxiliary.
